With Great Sadness the City Announces the Passing of City Councilman Theodore "Ted" Cooper



It is with great sadness the City of Edgewater announces the passing of City Councilman Theodore "Ted" Cooper. Councilman Cooper passed away at Bert Fish Medical Center in New Smyrna Beach Wednesday, November 30 after a sudden illness.

A memorial service was held for District 4 Council Representative Theodore "Ted" Cooper on Tuesday, December 6, 2011 at 2PM at the Edgewater Alliance Church. Councilman Cooper was born on February 21, 1950, to Harry and Alice Cooper of Schenectady, New York. He was an Army Veteran who served his country in the Vietnam War.

Mr. Cooper was elected to the Edgewater City Council in 2007. During his tenure, he also served as 1st Vice Chair of the Volusia County Transportation Planning Organization and on several other committees within that organization-Executive Committee, Budget

and Personnel Committee and the Legislative Issue Committee. He was also an alternate on the Central Florida Metropolitan Planning Organization Alliance. Additionally, he served on the boards of the Southeast Volusia Family YMCA, Water Alliance Volusia and the Regional Communications Center.

Prior to his service on the City Council, Mr. Cooper worked in the restaurant, newspaper and senior care industries. He was a member of several organizations including the Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks #1557, Fraternal Order of Eagles #4242 and the Loyal Order of Moose #1835. His interests included motorcycles, gardening and caring for seniors.

Councilman Cooper is survived by his longtime girlfriend, Barbara Kowall, daughter Dawne Thorne (Troy) of Illinois, grandson Matthew Thorne, sister Sandy Siebert of California, brother Tommy of New York and Ms. Kowall's daughter Michelle Abbey (Chad) and grandsons, Chase and Chance of Oklahoma. He was predeceased by his parents and siblings Harry, Billy and Irene. ArtsEtc has been chosen as the Edgewater Artist of the month for October, November, and December. ArtsEtc is a community of artists interested in exploring surface design and fiber arts through education, preservation and exhibition. They have exhibited their art in area galleries, museums and art centers as well as in an invitational to Valley Forge, NY. They share their talents with others through teaching and demonstrating at community events.

There are guest instructors, outside lecturers and self-directed hands-on workshops. Members are involved in printing, weaving, quilting, stamping, sewing, beading, making paper, painting, dyeing, and most other art forms. The group meets monthly at the Harris House studios on Douglas Street in New Smyrna Beach usually on the first Saturday of the month from 9:30am-2:00pm. They work on their own projects or in organized workshops to examine different techniques and arts. Membership is open to all artists, 18 years and older. You will receive an email copy of your bill in place of a paper bill. As the landlord or property manager, the paper bill will be mailed to the tenant at the service address and the email copy will be sent to you. You may cancel or change the way you receive your bill at any time.
