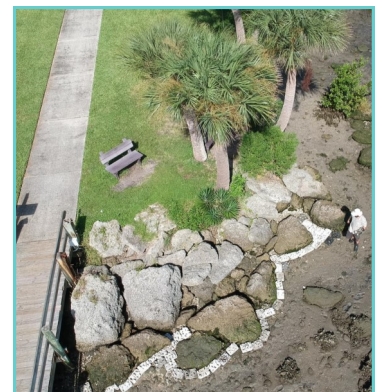
Edgewater has lifted all water restrictions on Reclaimed Water, but asks residents to voluntarily refrain from watering between the hours of 10:00 a.m. & 4:00 p.m.

PARK SHORELINE RESTORATIONS

Last year, Riverside Conservancy identified three estuarian waterside parks within the city of Edgewater, Florida as high priority restoration areas. These public parks include Menard-May, George R. Kennedy Memorial, and Veteran's Memorial. This year, RC will continue facilitating the restoration by creating living shorelines, which are riverfront or coastal areas that are vegetated with native plants.

The restoration of shorelines (by planting aquatic grasses and mangroves and restoring oyster beds) filters pollution that would otherwise flow into waterways and ground water after rain storms. Because shoreline plants and oysters are nature's water filters, living shorelines benefit the overall health of our citizens through cleaning our waterways and drinking water, creating habitats for wildlife, protecting our homes and businesses from storm surge and making our parks more beautiful!

These three highly popular riverfront parks are an important target for restoration, because they drain into the Indian River Lagoon. And by restoring living shorelines to these and other highly visible areas, we will be able to demonstrate to visitors the environmental, cultural, educational and economic value of living shorelines for our area.



EDGEWATER RESIDENTIAL PROJECTS

Edgewater City Council and City Manager have been diligent in planning for the future of the City by partnering with large, environmentally savvy property owners and other organizations, to create sustainable multi-use developments and by setting aside land for conservation. Projects below have been permitted and are mostly phased development over the next 20-50 years. Edgewater is managing projects to ensure smart growth practices are followed, maintaining a high quality of life for all residents and visitors.

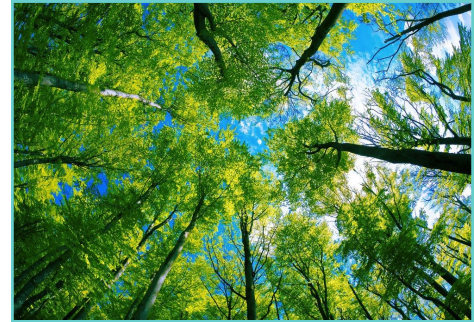

WATERING MATURE TREES

Trees offer beauty, shade, protection, cleaner air and cooler temperatures. Below are steps for watering mature trees when the weather is dry.



STEP 1 Use a meter or screwdriver to check soil moisture all around the drip line edge of the canopy. If the meter reads “dry” or soil at the bottom of the hole is dry and crumbly, the tree needs water.

STEP 2 Set up a soaker hose, drip irrigation, portable sprinkler or hand water below the canopy.

STEP 3 Set the hose to water at a low setting for one hour, soaking the soil 6 inches deep. If necessary, relocate the hose until all areas around the drip line have been watered.

STEP 4 Check again with a moisture meter or screwdriver a few days later. If the soil is moist, great! If not, extend the length of time that you water around the tree.

STEP 5 To reduce evaporation, add 6 inches of mulch in a circle around tree, shaped like a donut keeping 6 inches from the trunk.

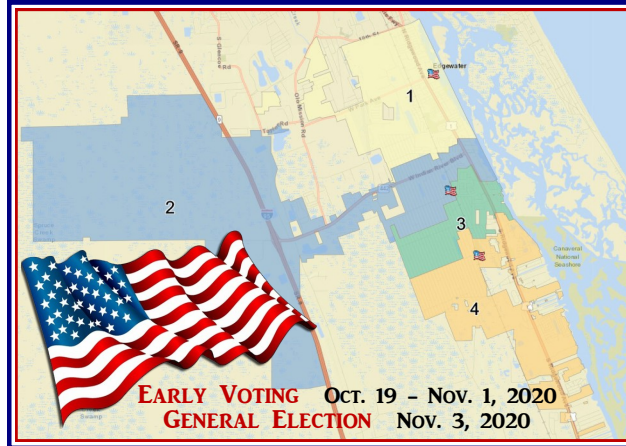
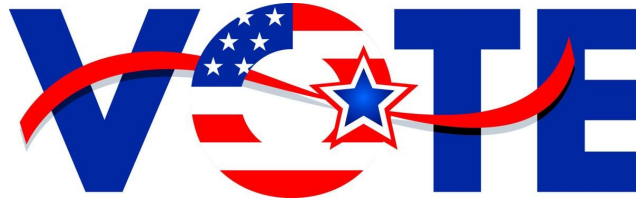
- 1 Submit entry info & photo(s) of decorations by 12/11/2020.
