

CONTAIN YARD WASTE FOR WEEKLY PICKUP



Edgewater encourages residents to bag or contain yard waste. ALL bagged or contained yard waste is picked up EVERY Wednesday, excluding most holiday weeks. Picking up individual piles of sticks and other small vegetative items slows removal. Contained yard waste can be picked up and emptied into the trucks much more quickly.

WATERING MATURE TREES

Trees offer beauty, shade, protection, cleaner air and cooler temperatures. Below are steps for watering mature trees when the weather is dry.

STEP 1 Use a meter or screwdriver to check soil moisture all around the drip line edge of the canopy. If the meter reads "dry" or soil at the bottom of the hole is dry and crumbly, the tree needs water.

STEP 2 Set up a soaker hose, drip irrigation, portable sprinkler or hand water below the canopy.

STEP 3 Set the hose to water at a low setting for one hour, soaking the soil 6 inches deep. If necessary, relocate the hose until all areas around the drip line have been watered.

STEP 4 Check again with a moisture meter or screwdriver a few days later. If the soil is moist, great! If not, extend the length of time that you water around the tree.

STEP 5 To reduce evaporation, add 6 inches of mulch in a circle around tree, shaped like a donut keeping 6 inches from the trunk.

FLOOD FACTS

As many Edgewater residents know firsthand, flooding can be a devastating event and no home is completely safe from flooding. Just one inch of water in a home can cause more than \$25,000 in damage.



CONSIDER THESE FLOOD FACTS:

- In the past 5 years, all 50 states have experienced floods or flash floods.
- Everyone lives in a flood zone. It is just a question of whether you live in a low, moderate or high risk area.
- Just a few inches of water from a flood can cause tens of thousands of dollars in damage.
- A car can easily be carried away by just two feet of floodwater.
- Most homeowner's insurance policies do not cover flood damage.
- You are eligible to purchase flood insurance if you are a renter, homeowner, or business owner and your property is located in a community that participates in the National Flood Insurance Program. Edgewater participates.
- It may take 30-60 days after purchase for a policy to take effect, so it is important to buy insurance before a storm approaches.
- Even though flood insurance is not federally required, anyone can be financially vulnerable to floods. People outside of mapped high-risk flood areas file nearly 25% of all National Flood Insurance Program insurance claims and receive one-third of Federal Disaster Assistance for flooding.
- Edgewater participates in the Community Rating System (CRS) and residents can qualify for an insurance premium discount.

RECLAIMED WATER USE

Daytime reclaimed water use has been much higher than normal, depleting the supply before a majority of users have an opportunity to use it in the evening and overnight hours. The City augments the supply of reclaimed water with surface water withdrawn from the borrow pit adjacent to the Wastewater Treatment Plant.



Due to ongoing dry conditions and in order to conserve irrigation water availability for all customers, Reclaimed Water Distribution pumps are being deactivated between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. daily. This protocol will continue until routine rainfall has returned.
