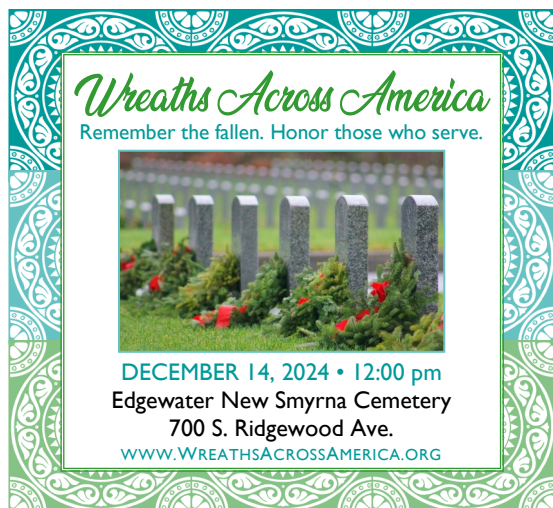

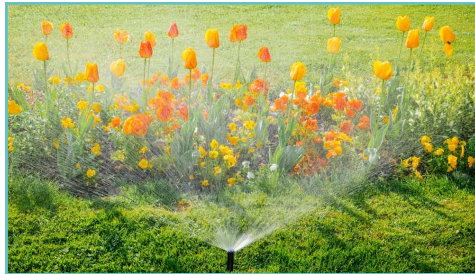

DID YOU KNOW THAT CONTAINED YARD WASTE IS PICKED UP WEEKLY?

Picking up individual piles of sticks and small vegetative debris slows removal. Because contained yard waste can be transferred into trucks much more quickly, the City of Edgewater encourages residents to bag or contain yard waste. Contained and bagged yard waste is picked up EVERY WEDNESDAY, excluding holiday weeks.



FLOOD FACTS

As many people know firsthand, flooding can be a devastating event and no home is completely safe from flooding. Just one inch of water in a home can cause more than \$25,000 in damage.

CONSIDER THESE FLOOD FACTS:

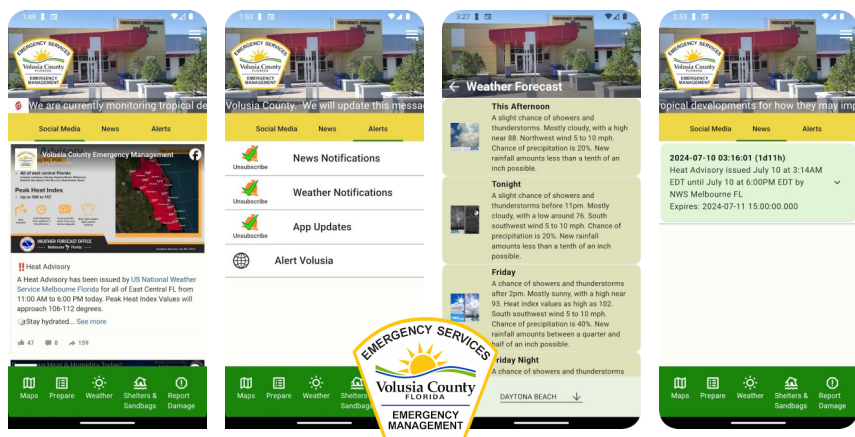
- ◆ In the past 5 years, all 50 states have experienced floods or flash floods.
- ◆ Everyone lives in a flood zone. It is just a question of whether you live in a low, moderate or high risk area.
- ◆ Just a few inches of water from a flood can cause tens of thousands of dollars in damage.
- ◆ A car can easily be carried away by just two feet of floodwater.



- ◆ Most homeowner's insurance policies do not cover flood damage.
- ◆ You are eligible to purchase flood insurance if you are a renter, homeowner, or business owner and your property is located in a community that participates in the National Flood Insurance Program. Edgewater participates.
- ◆ It may take 30-60 days after purchase for a policy to take effect, so it is important to buy insurance before a storm approaches.
- ◆ Even though flood insurance is not federally required, anyone can be financially vulnerable to floods. People outside of mapped high-risk flood areas file nearly 25% of all National Flood Insurance Program insurance claims and receive one-third of Federal Disaster Assistance for flooding.
- ◆ Edgewater participates in the Community Rating System (CRS) and residents can qualify for an insurance premium discount.

UPDATED EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT APP



Volusia County has launched a new Emergency Management app to enhance communication with residents and visitors during crises, such as hurricanes or wildfires. The app delivers real-time emergency notifications, situational updates, weather conditions, sandbag distribution points, shelter locations and evacuation alerts. The app also includes educational resources and preparedness tips for various potential disasters.

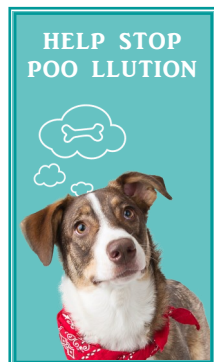
The previous app is no longer receiving updates or being monitored. Users are encouraged to delete the outdated app and download the new version to stay informed and prepared. Search for "Volusia Emergency Management" at the App Store or Google Play.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT



Edgewater's drainage is considered an open swale system. It is slow moving and designed to store and direct water to flow through it, while removing pollutants from entering ground water, ponds, lakes or the Indian River. It is not unusual for swales to hold water for several days after heavy rainfall. However, if water is standing in roads and sidewalks or water remains in swales longer than 72 hours after the last rain, please contact Environmental Services.

RULE #1, ALWAYS PICK UP #2



Cleaning up pet waste is part of being a responsible pet owner and is also required by City Code. When it rains, pet waste that is left on the ground gets washed into stormwater drains and drainage ditches which flow to our local waterways, without being treated! Bacteria, parasites and viruses found in pet waste can be harmful to water quality and human health.

Picking up after your pet is a neighborly and healthy thing to do! Remember to clean up pet waste in your own yard as well. Scoop waste into a bag and dispose of it in the garbage. Help keep our waterways clean, be part of the solution and help Stop "Poo"llution!

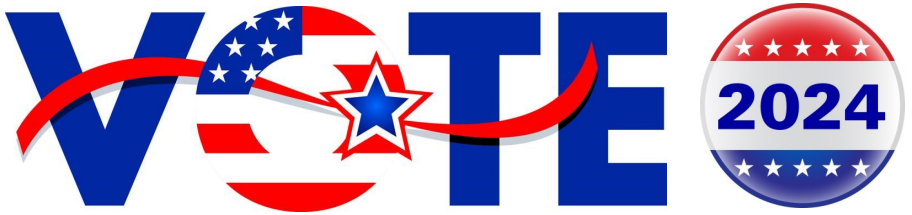
