### FLOOD FACTS



After living through hurricane Irma, the importance of being prepared for Hurricanes, that can bring heavy rain fall and cause flooding, is all too clear. Consider these flood facts:

- Everyone lives in a flood zone. It is just a question of whether you live in a low, moderate or high risk area.
- Just a few inches of water from a flood can cause tens of thousands of dollars in damage.
- A car can easily be carried away by just two feet of floodwater.
- Most homeowner's insurance policies do not cover flood damage.
- You are eligible to purchase flood insurance if you are a renter, homeowner, or business owner and your property is located in a NFIP-participating community.
   Edgewater participates in the National Flood Insurance Program.
- It may take 30-60 days after purchase for a policy to take effect, so it is important to buy insurance before a storm approaches.
- Even though flood insurance is not federally required, anyone can be financially vulnerable to floods.
   People outside of mapped high-risk flood areas file nearly 25% of all insurance claims.
- Edgewater participates in the Community Rating System (CRS) and residents can qualify for an insurance premium discount.

### STORMWATER RUNOFF

In recent years, the source of water pollution from industrial waste from factories has been greatly reduced. It's hard to believe, but approximately 60% of water pollution comes from things like runoff from washing cars, fertilizer from farms, gardens, lawns and PET WASTE.

Small sources add up to a big pollution problem. So, believe it or not, our common households are the biggest water pollution problem, not industry. Since they are small sources, we can do small things to eliminate the problem and clean up our waterways. It starts by realizing that our sewers and storm systems are separate and what goes into storm drains flows directly into the Indian River Lagoon.

### PROTECT FLORIDA'S WATER FROM "POO"LLUTION

When it rains, pet waste left on the ground gets washed into storm drains and stormwater drainage ditches which flow straight into the Indian River Lagoon...without being treated! YUCK!

Decaying waste carries diseases, uses up oxygen and sometimes releases ammonia. It also contains nutrients that encourage weed and algae growth, making water unsafe for swimming or drinking. Since bacteria, parasites, and viruses found in pet waste can be harmful to water quality and human health,

picking up after your pet being is the responsible, healthy and neighborly thing to do for you and the environment. Remember to clean up pet waste in your own yard too.

WHAT TO DO WITH PET WASTE? The preferred method of pet waste disposal is to scoop it, bag it and put it in the garbage. Landfills are designed to safely handle substances such as pet waste. An alternative is to flush waste only (NO BAGS) down the toilet. If you have City water then the water from your toilet goes to the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant where all pollutants are removed. If you have a septic system, then do not flush pet waste down the toilet. Flushing pet waste can potentially exceed the design capacity of the septic system. NEVER FLUSH CAT LITTER!

**CONTAIN YARD WASTE** 



Picking up individual piles of sticks and other small vegetative items is time consuming and slows down the operation. However, if you can put those items in a container that can be picked up and emptied into garbage trucks, it greatly improves our ability to provide timely service.

We commit to picking up ALL BAGGED AND CONTAINED YARD WASTE EVERY WEDNESDAY (excluding some holiday weeks), while uncontainable piles of vegetative debris are picked up on a continual route. So remember, IF YOU CAN CONTAIN IT, WE CAN GRAB IT...EVERY WEDNESDAY.


